Partners Group acquired Indian Sunsure Energy: On 08 Dec. 2022, Swiss-based global private equity firm Partners Group announced that on behalf of its clients, it has acquired majority stake in Indian company Sunsure Energy, which was founded in 2015 and has built solar power plants in India. Partners Group further added that moving onwards, Sunsure would tackle solar, wind, solar-wind hybrid and battery storage projects in the future, with a target capacity of over 3GW. The power would be sold directly to commercial and industrial customers through long-term power purchase agreements. Under Partners Group's ownership, Sunsure is now expected to become a next-generation independent power producer, with a total investment of up to \$400 million.

1. Commercial Related News - Switzerland

i. Bilateral: India-Switzerland

• Partners Group acquired Indian Sunsure Energy: On 08 Dec. 2022, Swiss-based global private equity firm Partners Group announced that on behalf of its clients, it has acquired majority stake in Indian company Sunsure Energy, which was founded in 2015 and has built solar power plants in India. Partners Group further added that moving onwards, Sunsure would tackle solar, wind, solar-wind hybrid and battery storage projects in the future, with a target capacity of over 3GW. The power would be sold directly to commercial and industrial customers through long-term power purchase agreements. Under Partners Group's ownership, Sunsure is now expected to become a next-generation independent power producer, with a total investment of up to \$400 million. www.fuw.ch/partners-group-uebernimmt-indische-sunsure-energy-766941700017

ii. Switzerland External

- a. Bilateral / Multilaterals Meetings & Visits
 - Department of the Environment, Transport, Energy and Communications DETEC reported that Swiss Federal Councillor and Head of DETEC 'Simonetta Sommaruga' took part in the Pentalateral Energy Forum in Brussels and discussed crisis management and risk prevention in the energy sector with the ministers of the Penta countries (Belgium, Germany, France, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, Austria and Switzerland). DETEC also informed that the Penta Forum is a platform for transnational cooperation and plays a pioneering role in shaping the European energy and electricity system and in Dec. 2021, the Member States signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on risk preparedness in the electricity sector. After taking stock of the current situation, the participants of the Penta Forum dealt with the question of how risks in the energy sector can be avoided and met with their counterparts from Norway, Denmark, Sweden and Ireland (North Seas Energy Cooperation) and the UK Energy Secretary and discussed the next steps towards a shared vision for achieving a decarbonised energy system by 2050. - Switzerland UK Bilateral Meeting on Mutual Recognition Agreement in the Financial Sector: On 22 Dec. 2022, Swiss Federal Department of Finance FDF reported that Swiss Federal Councillor and Head of FDF Ueli Maurer made his last trip as Federal Counsellor to UK and met his British counterpart and the United Kingdom's new Chancellor of the Exchequer, Jeremy Hunt. Discussion were focussed on the matter related to financial sector and both ministers' welcomed the progress made in the Negotiations on A Mutual Recognition Agreement In The Financial Sector, and looked forward to its finalisation by the end of summer 2023. DF further added that the agreement is aimed at facilitating or improving cross-border market access in the banking, insurance, asset management and capital market infrastructure sectors. With this agreement, Switzerland and the United Kingdom wish to reaffirm their commitment to the importance of open financial markets and international financial stability, and to consolidate their position as leading international financial centres in Europe. As Switzerland UK are committed to protecting investors and insured persons, as well as maintaining market integrity and financial stability, while adhering to the highest regulatory standards. www.admin.ch/gov/en/start/documentation/media-releases.msg-id-92373.html

b. MoU, Agreements, Sanctions & Consultations

• Switzerland Switzerland - Poland signed Bilateral Agreement towards Second Swiss Contribution: On 05 Dec. 2022, Swiss State Secretariat for Economic Affairs SECO reported that State Secretary for SECO Hélène Budliger Artieda and Poland's Minister for Development Funds and Regional Policy Grzegorz Puda signed a Bilateral Agreement in Warsaw, which implements the new Swiss-Polish cooperation programme, which is part of Switzerland's second enlargement contribution to selected EU member states. SECO further added that of the 15 countries receiving the second Swiss contribution, Poland is the recipient of the largest allocation amounting to CHF 320.1 million. The new

Swiss-Polish cooperation programme aims to support Poland's strategic reforms, strengthen Swiss-Polish partnerships. It focuses on two programmes:

- O The Polish-Swiss Development of Towns programme, a major project costing CHF 278.7 million aimed at supporting the economic and social development of small and medium-sized towns in disadvantaged regions of Poland.
- o to promote the excellence of research and the capacity for innovation of Polish universities and businesses through greater collaboration with Switzerland costing around CHF 35 million.

- Switzerland recognizes Croatia's accession to Schengen: On 21 Dec. 2022, Swiss Federal Department of Justice and Police reported that following up on the decision of Council of the European Union (EU) on December 8, 2022, to make Croatia as part of EU from 01 Jan. 2023, Swiss Federal Council during its meeting recognized accession of Croatia into Schengen. With Croatia's accession to the Schengen area, identity checks at Croatia's land and sea borders with other Schengen countries would no longer apply as of January 1, 2023. There would be no more controls at the airports with the flight schedule change on March 26, 2023 and Croatia would also be able to issue Schengen visas from the beginning of 2023. The Swiss Federal Council decision is a further development of the Schengen acquis, which Switzerland has committed itself to adopt as part of the Schengen Association Agreement. - Switzerland-France agreed on Sustainable Tax Regulations for the Home Office: On 22 Dec. 2022, Swiss Federal Department of Finance FDF reported that from January 1, 2023, up to 40 percent of the working hours per year can be worked from home without this having any impact on the State of the taxation of income from gainful employment especially for cross-border commuters as Switzerland France agreed on sustainable tax regulations for the home office. Switzerland and France, with their joint declaration of 29 June 2022 on the introduction of an interim agreement on teleworking applicable to cross-border workers expressed the importance of establishing new sustainable tax regimes for working from home to accompany these developments. Credit Suisse raised USD 5 billion via bonds: On 05 Dec. 2022, Swiss based leading wealth manager

raised USD 5 billion through various securities issued by the holding company and AT1 bonds. AT1
bonds are allocated to the bank's core capital, meaning creditors are jointly liable for a bank's losses.

With this, Swissquote is driving its international expansion also to strengthens its presence in the Middle East. Swissquote further added that on 07 Dec. 2022, the subsidiary, Swissquote Capital Markets Ltd, received a license from the state-run Cypriot financial regulator CySEC. In addition to the locations in Luxembourg and Malta, this is the third location in the EU. - FOAG increased Tariff Quota for butter by 3000 tonnes: On 06 Dec. 2022, Swiss Federal Office for Agriculture FOAG reported that taking an action on the application submitted by the milk sector organisation, FOAG decided to increase the tariff quota for butter by 3000 tonnes from 1 January 2023 until Dec. 2023. The additional import quantity is 3000 tonnes of butter. FOAG also added that according to industry estimates, the domestic supply of butter would again be insufficient to fully meet demand in the coming year as the total quantity of milk is likely to remain low. Therefore, in addition to cheese production, too little milk remains for butter production. - Switzerland recorded 40,188 new business in 2020: On 07 Dec. 2022, Swiss Federal Statistical Office FSO through its results from Statistics on Business Demography (UDEMO) reported that in 2020, 40 188 businesses were founded in Switzerland, which represented 7.1% of all businesses active during 2020. FSO also added that the vast majority of these businesses created from scratch employed only one person and this size class had the highest creation rate of 10.7%. added that it would only look after customers from ten "mainly European countries" in the areas of private banking and end customers of external asset managers. Switzerland occupies 5th place in the country ranking of the top 100 companies: On 29 Dec. 2022, based on the results of an analysis by the auditing and consulting firm EY, which examined the market capitalization of the highest valued companies worldwide every six months. EY based on the data available reported that Switzerland occupied the 5th place in the country ranking of the top 100 companies with Swiss-based Nestlé, with a market capitalisation of \$321.2 billion (CHF297 billion), ranked 23rd among the world's most valuable stock-market listed companies, followed by pharma groups Roche and Novartis are ranked 32nd and 45th respectively. A total of nine Swiss companies made it into the top 300, in addition to the three companies already mentioned, Chubb Limited (ranked 144), Glencore (153), Richemont (182), Zurich (190), UBS (238) and ABB (246). EY concluded that, the stable presence shows that Switzerland continues to be successful in international business and, as a relatively small country, plays an important role in the European and global economy. EY reported that the study is based on the closing data available on 27 Dec. 2022. TX Group added that after the acquisition of Clear Channel Switzerland, it would expand the business into a substantial mainstay in terms of sales and earnings. The TX Group subsidiary Goldbach is already active in the poster and digital outdoor advertising business through its majority holding (52.3%) in Neo Advertising. Further, the combined turnover of the two companies Neo Advertising and Clear Channel Switzerland amounts to more than CHF 100 million. - SECO reported an increase in unemployment by 2% in Nov. 2022: On 07 Dec. 2022, Swiss State Secretariat for Economic Affairs SECO reported that at the end pf Nov. 2022, 91,327 unemployed persons were registered with Regional Employment Centres (RAV), which compared with Oct. 2022 recorded an increase by 2% (1,691 more than Oct. 2022). SECO further reported that as compared with Nov. 2021, unemployment fell by 24,917 people (-21.4%). A total of 164,496 jobseekers were registered, which correspondent to 4,402 more than in the previous month. - Swiss Federal Council adopted EU electricity savings target in Switzerland on a voluntary basis: On 21 Dec. 2022, Swiss Federal Office of Energy SFOE reported that Swiss Federal Council held a debate on the measures decided and planned by the EU to reduce electricity consumption and curb electricity prices and also decided to adopt the EU's electricity savings target in Switzerland on a voluntary basis. By adopting the EU electricity savings target, Switzerland contributes to lowering wholesale prices and strengthening security of supply in Europe. The reduction in electricity consumption is to be achieved as part of the ongoing energy saving campaign and further the Federal Council has also decided to continue the campaign until winter 2023/24. With the adoption of EU electricity savings, Switzerland would reduce electricity consumption in Switzerland by 10 percent from January to March 2023 and in November and December 2023 compared to the average of the last five years. www.admin.ch/gov/de/start/dokumentation/medienmitteilungen.msg-id-92331.html
- Switzerland signed contract for a second reserve power plant: On 22 Dec. 2022, Swiss Federal Department of the Environment, Transport, Energy and Communications reported that to strengthen Switzerland's energy supply, Swiss Federal Council signed 2nd contract with Groupe E's for a reserve power plant, which would already be available in the current winter of 2022/23. With the existing thermal power plant (Cornaux 1) of the western Swiss energy supply company Groupe E, the Swiss Federal Council has now contracted another reserve power plant with a capacity of up to 36 megawatts (MW). This means that a power plant reserve totaling around 286 MW is available this winter. With the provision of this reserve power plant, the municipality of Cornaux and the canton of Neuchâtel are working together with the federal government to strengthen security of supply. • ABB partnered with Biliden to reduce carbon footprint of its industrial products: On 14 Dec. 2022, Swiss based leader in technology electrification and automation company ABB, announced that to reduce greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions while driving the transition to a more circular economy, it is working with Boliden, the Swedish mining and smelting company, to build a strategic co-operation to use low carbon footprint copper in its electromagnetic stirring (EMS) equipment and high-efficiency electric motors. For this, ABB confirmed that it would use Boliden's certified recycled and low-carbon copper in electric motors and electromagnetic stirring technologies. Apart from using recycled copper, ABB has committed to increase the use of recycled electric steel (e-steel) and recycled aluminum. The move is also an important step in closing the circularity loop that has already seen ABB designing its motors to be up to 98 percent recyclable, with the remaining two percent of materials available to be incinerated for heat recovery. EFTA-Indonesia held 1st Joint Committee meeting in Jakarta: On 07 Dec. 2022, EFTA Secretariat reported that, EFTA States (Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland) and Indonesia held 1st Joint Committee Meeting in Jakarta after the entry into force of their Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA) on 1 Nov. 2021. The meeting was preceded by the first meeting of the Sub-Committee on Trade in Goods and the Sub-Committee on Cooperation and Capacity Building on 6 December 2022. The Joint Committee discussed the operation of the Agreement and confirmed its good functioning. It exchanged views on trade relations between Indonesia and EFTA, the perspectives of the Agreement and external economic relations. The Joint Committee also held a discussion on a planned analysis of preference utilisation rates under the Agreement and targeted promotional

activities based on such studies and implementation of the chapter on trade and sustainable development and the progress achieved in pursuing the objectives set out in that chapter. EFTA-United States held 8th Trade Policy Dialogue: On 16 Dec. 2022, EFTA Secretariat reported that European Free Trade Association (EFTA) States (Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland) led by Swiss State Secretary Helene Budliger Artieda met with representatives of the Office of the United States Trade Representative (USTR) for the 8th edition of the EFTA-US Trade Policy Dialogue in Washington DC. USTR presented President Biden's trade policy priorities and provided updates on Washington's activities under the EU-US Trade and Technology Council and the Indo-Pacific Economic Framework for Prosperity. The EFTA States likewise set out their trade policy agenda, including on negotiations for free trade agreements and horizontal projects on trade and sustainable development and preference utilisation. Discussions further extended to trade relations with the Asia-Pacific region and Africa. Delegations also highlighted their priorities in the context of the World Trade Organization (WTO) after the most recent WTO Ministerial Conference, with a special emphasis on multilateral reform efforts. The EFTA-US Trade Policy Dialogue is held on a regular basis since 2013 and serves as a forum for exchanging views and experiences, as well as raising bilateral trade www.efta.int/Free-Trade/news/EFTA-and-United-States-hold-8th-Trade-Policy-Dialogueissues. 533251

iii. Free Trade Agreement

- EFTA States-Kosovo held 2nd Round of Negotiations for FTA: On 02 Dec. 2022, EFTA Secretariat reported that from 29 Nov. 01 Dec. 2022, delegations from EFTA States (Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland) and the Republic of Kosovo met in Prishtina for the 2nd Round of Negotiations for a Free Trade Agreement. EFTA Secretariat added that during the trade negotiations chapters on competition and dispute settlement as well as the annexes on rules of origin and trade facilitation were concluded. During this round, Kosovo highlighted their strong wish to include trade in services in the negotiations. Both sides therefore agreed to continue their exchanges on the way forward on services at heads level. In 2021, EFTA States exported goods worth USD 59 million to Kosovo while imports from Kosovo totalled USD 49 million. EFTA's main exports to Kosovo in 2021 were vehicles, tobacco and pharmaceutical products. - EFTA-Moldova held 5th round of FTA negotiations: On 07 Dec. 2022, EFTA Secretariat reported that from 05-06 Dec. 2022, EFTA States (Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland) and the Republic of Moldova held the 5th round of negotiations towards a Free Trade Agreement in Geneva.

The parties had in-depth discussions and finalised most of their open issues coming very close to the conclusion of their negotiations & a few remaining issues would be clarified early next year. EFTA Secretariat also reported that the total trade between the parties has been growing exponentially over the last ten years. In 2021, total trade between the EFTA States and the Republic of Moldova reached USD 79 million, of which USD 34 million represented imports from Moldova and USD 45 million represented exports from the EFTA States. Exports from EFTA States to Moldova had an average annual growth rate of 21.3% over the last five years.
