3. Trade Promotional Activities organized in the month of Febraury2023

(a) Ambassador visits Port Sudan (13-15 February 2023)

Ambassador Mr. B.S. Mubarak, called on the Acting Governor of Red Sea State H.E. Rabih Fadl Al-Karim, and discussed issues related to bilateral cooperation between India and the Red Sea State. During his visit, Ambassador visited the Sea Ports Corporation and held meeting with a delegation led by C. Eng. Ibrahim Yousif Mohmed, General Manager of Sea Ports Corporation. A familiarization visit was organized for the Ambassador to interact with the officials at the training centre and various port facilities. Several areas related to cooperation between sea ports in India and Port Sudan were discussed. During his visit Ambassador held a meeting with members of Chamber of Shipping Agencies of Sudan and discussed ways and means to facilitate and promote shipping and sea trade between India and Sudan.

During his visit, Ambassador also visited the site of Dama Dama Oil Terminal project Phase-II which is being developed by Tridel Technologies, a multinational organization in Environmental Industry, with offices in India, UAE and Australia. Ambassador also visited the Sea Port Authority Hospital and discussed collaboration between Indian hospitals and Sea Port Authority Hospital in Port Sudan. Ambassador also visited the Red Sea University and held meeting with the delegation led by Dr. Abdelgadir Badawi Mohammed Hussien, Vice Chancellor of the Red Sea University. Several areas of cooperation including in the field of marine sciences, ITEC scholarships and collaboration between Indian universities were discussed.

(B) 3rd edition of the Sudan International Agricultural Forum (SIAF-2023) was organized on 20 February 2023 at Friendship Hall, Khartoum by M/s Manssoft Integrated Solution Co. in collaboration with the Federal Ministry of Agriculture and Forest of Sudan. The event was inaugurated by Dr. Abu Bakar Elbushra, Minister of Agriculture and Forest of Sudan, and attended by the diplomatic corps, agriculture experts & researchers, farmers, and companies operating in the Agricultural sector. The Ambassador of India Mr. B.S. Mubarak gave a presentation titled 'Strengthening Sudan-India partnership in the area of Agriculture: Overview of India's potential in Agriculture, Agro-Machinery, Agro-Chemicals Industry and Hybrid Seeds'. Ambassador also stressed on the export potential of a variety of agricultural products from Sudan to India. During his presentation Ambassador spoke on the importance of 'International Year of Millets-2023' and the benefits of millets. A video titled 'Emerging India' was also screened during the event. Experts and researchers also shared their experiences and talked about modern technologies, challenges of transferring modern agricultural technology, agro-financing, microfinance, and solutions related to agriculture. India is one of the largest exporter of agriculture machineries to Sudan. Annually, about 2500 tractors are exported from India to Sudan. Sudan is also a major exporter of Agricultural commodities to India.

4. (i) Trade and Commercial Delegation from India to Sudan:

(a) Ambassador of India Mr. B.S. Mubarak received in his office on 05.02.2023 Mr Piyush Patil, Head of Farm Equipment Exports for North & West Africa of Mahindra & Mahindra (M&M) Ltd India. M&M along with their Sudanese partner Mahgoub Sons Engineering have planned launch of Mahindra 6075 tractor in Nyala City, South Darfur on 11th Feb 2023 to contribute towards agri-mechanization efforts in Sudan.

(b) Apollo Hospitals Group visits Sudan.

Apollo Hospitals Group, one of the largest hospital networks in Afro-Asia, have formed a clinical partnership with Sharg Alneel Hospitals in Khartoum. The Apollo Team, led by Ms. Sneha Sasidharan, Deputy General Manager-International Division, consisted of Dr. N. Ragavan, Senior Consultant Uro-Oncologist, Dr. R. Sankar, Senior Consultant Paediatric Orthopaedics, and Dr. Muralidharan, Senior Consultant Spine Surgeon visited Sudan. The delegation also visited the Embassy of India and called on H.E B.S. Mubarak, Ambassador of India to Sudan and briefed him on their plans to strengthen partnership in the area of healthcare with Hospitals in Sudan. This would involve training and capacity building for doctors and paramedics from Sudan. On their visit to Khartoum, a delegation from Apollo's first and flagship hospital, Apollo Hospitals Chennai, India announced the partnership with Sharg Alneel Hospitals in Khartoum.

(ii) Trade and Commercial Delegation from Sudan to India:

(A) An eight-member delegation from the Telecommunications and Post Regulatory Authority (TPRA) of Sudan called on Mr. B.S. Mubarak, Ambassador of India on 6 February 2023 at the Indian Embassy. Before their proceeding on visit to Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) office in New Delhi from 8-10 February 2023. TRAI shared India's experience in the area of telecommunication and regulation with the Sudanese delegation.

(B) A two member delegation from the National Audit Chamber of Sudan called on Mr. B.S. Mubarak, Ambassador of India on 7 February 2023 at the Indian Embassy. Before their proceeding on visit to attend an International Workshop on "Climate Change Mitigation and Adaptation Strategies including Green Finance" being organized by the International Centre for Environment Audit & Sustainable Development (iCED) at Jaipur from 13 to 17 February 2023.

(C) The Sudanese Cultural and Atrisan troupe participated at the 36th edition of Surajkund International Crafts Festival and presented its first performance on 5th February which was greatly liked by the audience. Sudanese handicraft pavilion at the festival was visited by both Indian and international visitors.

Ambassador met several participating companies along with the event organizer Mr. Osama Abbud from Expo Team Co. Ambassador appreciated the role played by Mr. Osama Abbud in promoting poultry industry in Sudan through exhibitions, through attracting international companies to market and invest in Sudan and by linking the stake holders (producers, manufacturers and suppliers) of the poultry industry of Sudan.

Total Indian investments in Sudan up to December 2020 amounted to more than US\$ 471.5 million with 86 investment projects including 53 industrial projects, 21 service projects as well as 12 agricultural projects. (As per the National Investment Authority of Sudan)

11. Status of ongoing major investments by Indian PSUs/Pvt. Sector in Sudan, and proposed Indian Investments in Sudan:

ONGC Videsh Ltd (OVL) invested over US\$ 2.3 billion in undivided Sudan. Currently, there is an arbitration going on due to a default in payment by the Sudanese side.

12. Analysis of Investment opportunities in Sudan:

Despite the challenges that Sudan is experiencing in the national economy, investors from Gulf, Turkey, China, and India have already entered Sudan. Chambers and Partners have identified the following investment opportunities in Sudan:

- Natural resources/mining: especially gold.
- Agriculture: With the Nile River running through it, Sudan has more than 150 million hectares of arable land.
- Livestock: Sudan has national animal resources, which include cattle, camels, sheep, goats, poultry, horses, and an annual stock of more than 110,000 tonnes of fish. The most important animal products in Sudan are milk, meat, poultry, skins, fur and wool.
- Transport: As Africa's third-largest country and bordering seven countries, Sudan offers great opportunities for investment in the transport sector.
- Industry: Investment opportunities in the industry in Sudan include the following subsectors: agri-processing, food, spinning and textiles, leather, chemicals, pharmaceuticals, oil and soap, engineering, building materials and refractories, and printing and packaging.

13. Status of trade and investment-related issues taken up by the Mission with the Government of Sudan:

The Mission is continuously discussing the issues related to trade and investment with trade bodies of Sudan, the Ministry of Trade and Supply, and other Stakeholders

14. Details and Result of meeting & interactions of the Mission with Trade, Industry & Economic Ministries / Department / Agencies in Sudan:

(i) Mr. B.S. Mubarak, Ambassador along with officials of the Embassy called on Mr. Mohmed Ali Mustafa Sharaf Edin, Secretary General of Taxation Chamber of Sudan on 1 February 2023 and discussed several issues of mutual interest. Ambassador offered training programmes for the members of the Taxation Chamber of Sudan under the ITEC programme and also briefed the Secretary General about India's taxation reforms.

(ii) Ambassador welcomed in his office a delegation from the Sudanese Universities Association led by the newly elected Secretary General Prof. Ali Alsayed along with Dr. Ashraf Shegedi Deputy Vice Chancellor of Alzaiem Alazhari University. The delegation briefed about their recent participation at FICCI Higher Education Summit in New Delhi and the MoU that was signed between the Indian Universities Association and the Sudanese Universities Association.

Several issues related to cooperation in the areas of education, scientific research, capacity building and opening of overseas campuses of prominent Indian Universities were discussed during the meeting.

There is no Commerce Budget in EOI, Khartoum, for the FY 2022-23.

21. Some Important Economic & commercial developments:

The inflation rate in January 2023 dropped to 83 %, compared to 87.32 % recorded in December 2022.

In February 2023, Sudan's Sovereignty Council and the government approved the 2023 Federal budget after a delay of over a month. Budget revenues amounted to 7.363 trillion SDG, and public spending amounted to 8.196 trillion SDG, with a deficit of 1.4 % of GDP. The state seeks to increase revenues and bridge the budget deficit by expanding the tax umbrella, raising taxes and rationalizing government spending.

The Sudanese authorities have raised customs duties on 130 commodities, including gasoline and wheat, to cover the expected deficit in this year's budget. The tariff hike, which immediately entered into force on 28 February 2023, would increase the prices of many imported and local goods amid the country's stagflation. The Customs Authority stated that the amendment of customs categories came following the government's decision.

The increase in customs duties for transport vehicles of various weights ranged between 25 and 40 percent, while electric cars were exempted from any customs duties, and no new amendments were made to the customs of four-wheel drive vehicles. Customs increases affected meat, fish, fruits, spices, and luxury goods, between 20 and 40 percent.
