3. Trade Promotional Activities organized in the month of November 2022

i. On 01.11.2022, the Ambassador held a Press briefing with more than 30 journalists and print media and announced a visit of a Multi-Product Business Delegation to be led by the Federation of Indian Export Organisations (FIEO) from14-17 November 2022 to Sudan. Mr. Haitham Al Tijani, Secretary General, and Mr. Amroo Jafar, Vice Secretary-General from the Union of Chamber of Commerce, Union Chamber of Commerce also joined the Ambassador. During the press briefing, the Ambassador and Mr. Amroo also responded to queries from participating journalists related to the commercial events, India-Sudan bilateral trade, and various activities organized by the Embassy to boost trade.

ii. On 5 November 2022, the Embassy organized a day long Business Seminar titled 'Strengthening India – Sudan Business Partnership' at Hotel Al Salam, Khartoum. The event was organized in hybrid mode. Participants from Sudan attended in physical mode while those from India joined in virtual mode. The seminar aimed to explore the opportunities to promote India-Sudan bilateral trade, investment opportunities in Sudan, and trade prospects in priority sectors of mutual interest. The discussion also included bilateral tie-ups and business initiatives. H.E. Mrs. Ahlam Madani Mehdi, Hon'ble Federal Minister of Investment of Sudan was the Chief Guest.

iii. The Embassy in collaboration with the Federation of Indian Export Organization (FIEO), India, and the Union of Chambers of Commerce, Sudan organized a two-day business event and Business-to-Business (B2B) meetings on 15 & 16 November 2022 at the premises of the Union Chamber of Commerce. 14 Indian companies were part of the delegation headed by FIEO. The B2B meetings were held to facilitate interaction and tie-ups with Sudanese companies with the visiting 14-member multi-sectorial Indian business delegation led by Mr. Manish Sharma, Regional Head, FIEO (North Region), to Sudan. Inaugural Ceremony for the B2B meetings was organized on 15 November and was graced by the presence of H.E. Mrs Amal Salih Saad Mohamed, Federal Minister of Trade & Supply, Sudan as the Chief Guest; Dr Hassabo, President of National Chamber of Importers, Khartoum, Sudan; HE Mr. B S Mubarak, Ambassador of India; and Mr. Manish Sharma, Regional Head, FIEO (NR). In two

days of the B2B meetings, more than 500 Sudanese members of the business community interacted with the representatives of the visiting Indian companies. The delegation also paid a familiarization visit to the 3rd session of the Sudan Agrotech Expo, which was being organized from 14-17 November 2022 at Sudanese Fairs Ground, Khartoum.

iv. On 16 November 2022, the Embassy organized a 'Networking Meet with the Visiting Indian Business Delegation' for discussions on promoting business partnerships, at Hotel Kanon. Prominent Sudanese businessmen from various sectors, business facilitators, representatives from the government, and representatives of various Sudanese trade bodies attended the event.

v. On 24 November 2022, the Ambassador joined Engineer Abdel Wahed Abdel Moneim, Ministry of Infrastructure and Transportation, Khartoum State and various dignitaries at the inauguration of the Sudan Construct Show Exhibition 2022 at Fairs Ground, Khartoum-Burri. Sudan Construct is an International Exhibition in the areas of Infrastructure and Construction. Several companies including Indian companies in the areas of construction equipment, building materials, electric components, waterproofing and paints participated in the Expo.

vi. Ambassador received a delegation from the State of South Darfur headed by the Governor of the State Mr. Hamid Altigany Hanon, on November 24, 2022. Several areas of cooperation including Investments, cooperation in agriculture and capacity building were discussed.

4. (i) **Trade and Commercial Delegation from India to Sudan:**

• An Indian delegation led by the Chairman of the Indian Oilseeds and Produce Exporters Promotion Council (IOPEPC), Mr. Nilesh Vira visited Sudan to participate at the 5th Sudanese International Oil Seeds Conference held from 18-19 November 2022. More than 30 representatives from Indian companies participated in the conference. At the invitation of the Union Chamber of Commerce, the Ambassador participated in the inauguration ceremony of the conference.

• The visiting delegation from IOPEPC held meetings with the Ambassador at the Embassy premises and also held meetings with Prof. Ahmed Obeid Hassan, Executive Director of the Chamber of Oil and Agricultural Crops (Sudanese Chambers of Industries Association). Several initiatives to collaborate with the Sudanese agricultural producers were discussed during the meeting.

Total Indian investments in Sudan up to December 2020 amounted to more than US\$ 471.5 million with 86 investment projects including 53 industrial projects, 21 service projects as well as 12 agricultural projects.(As per National Investment Authority of Sudan)

11. Status of ongoing major investments by Indian PSUs/Pvt. Sector in Sudan, and proposed Indian Investments in Sudan:

ONGC Videsh Ltd (OVL) invested over US\$ 2.3 billion in undivided Sudan. Currently there is an arbitration going on due to default in payment by the Sudanese side.

12. Analysis of Investment opportunities in Sudan:

Despite the challenges that Sudan is experiencing in the National economic, investors from Gulf, Turkey, China, and India have already entered Sudan. Chambers and Partners have identified the following investment opportunities in Sudan:

- Natural resources/mining: especially gold.
- Agriculture: With the Nile River running through it, Sudan has more than 150 million hectares of arable land.
- Livestock: Sudan has national animal resources, which include cattle, camels, sheep, goats, poultry, horses, and an annual stock of more than 110,000 tonnes of fish. The most important animal products in Sudan are milk, meat, poultry, skins, fur and wool.
- Transport: As Africa's third-largest country and bordering seven countries, Sudan offers great opportunities for investment in the transport sector.
- Industry: Investment opportunities in industry in Sudan include following sub-sectors: agri-processing, food, spinning and textiles, leather, chemicals, pharmaceuticals, oil and soap, engineering, building materials and refractories, and printing and packaging.

13. Status of trade and investment related issues taken up by the Mission with Government of Sudan:

Mission is continuously discussing the issues related to trade and investment with trade bodies of Sudan, Ministry of Trade and Supply and other Stake holders

14. Details and Results of meeting & interactions of the Mission with Trade, Industry & Economic Ministries / Department / Agencies in Sudan:

On 2 November 2022, the Ambassador of India, H.E. Mr. B.S. Mubarak along with Second Secretary (Consular) Mr. Anil Kumar met with the Dean of Nahda College, Dr. Eman Basheir Nour Eldaym.

The Embassy in collaboration with the Federation of Indian Export Organization (FIEO), India, and the Union of Chambers of Commerce, Sudan organized a two-day business

event and Business-to-Business (B2B) meetings on 15 & 16 November 2022 at the premises of the Union Chamber of Commerce.

18. Aid/ Assistance received by Sudan from other countries/international agencies, funding organizations etc:

On 20.11.2022 The United States government provided over 47,000 metric tons of sorghum to address the worsening food crisis in Sudan. In a statement, the U.S. Embassy in Khartoum stated that the items were provided by the U.S. Agency for International Development's (USAID) Bureau for Humanitarian Assistance through the Bill Emerson Humanitarian Trust and distributed by the World Food Programme (WFP). The donation is within the framework of U.S. humanitarian aid support to Sudan.

On 24.11.2022, the Ukrainian Council of Ministers approved a decree by President Volodymyr Zelenskyy on the provision of humanitarian aid to the countries of Africa and Asia. Ukraine will provide 125,000 tons of wheat to three African countries including Sudan and Yemen under a Humanitarian Food Programme.

On 07.11.2022, Saudi Arabia pledged to invest USD 3 billion dollars in Sudan, announced the Sovereign Council following a meeting between General Abdel Fattah al-Burhan and Crown Prince

Mohammed bin Salman. Saudi Public Investment Fund (PIF) has established five regional investment companies, including Sudan.
